Man of the Year

Brother Mike Eskew

This year, the Chi Chapter honored Mike Eskew with the Man of the Year Award. Brother Eskew was initiated into Chi in 1968 before beginning his remarkable, 30+ year career with UPS. While with UPS, he spearheaded the company's expansion into West Germany in 1976, and managed the industrial engineering function of the UPS air group from 1984 to 1991. During that time, UPS introduced next-day air service, Saturday delivery service, and international delivery service. He then became the senior vice president of engineering and corporate development, and is responsible for the design, construction and maintenance of all UPS facilities. On Jan. 1, 2002, Brother Eskew was named President and Chief Executive Officer of the company he has served since leaving graduate school. He retired in 2007 after serving six years as chairman and chief executive officer. He continues to serve on the Board of Directors.

As one of the country's most visible businessmen, Brother Eskew has remained active in the community as well. He is a trustee of the UPS Foundation and the Annie E. Casey Foundation, which is the country's largest foundation dedicated to disadvantaged youth. He also serves on the Boards of Directors of the 3M Corporation, IBM and Eli Lilly. He is the former chairman of the U.S. China Business Council and also served

on the President's Export Council.

In addition to honoring Brother Eskew, the Chi Chapter also inducted Mike Cline into the Chi Hall of Fame. Brother Cline was initiated in 1984 and has served the state of Indiana since June 13, 2010 as the Commissioner of the Department of Transportation (INDOT). As Commissioner of INDOT, former Governor Mitch Daniels, and now Mike Pence, have entrusted Cline with overseeing all aspects of one of the state's largest agencies. INDOT employs over 4,000 employees and is responsible for the state's highway system that includes over 11,000 centerline miles, nearly 6,000 bridges and an annual construction budget

This year's team consisted of Colin Swingler as the driver, Daniel Leeds as the crew chief, and Ben Townsend, Eric Sass, Nicholas Belotti, Paul Johnson, and Colin O'Toole making up the crew. This year was Colin Swingler's last year as the driver for the team after serving as the driver for the past three years. Next year Daniel Leeds will take over as the driver.

This year's race would prove to be the closest our team has come to a victory since the team was restarted not long after the chapter's refunding. On lap 61, the third place kart drove into the back of the Kappa Sigma kart and was tangled keeping Swingler from getting away from the accident. The kart would have to be taken back to the pits and restarted thus eliminating our chances for the win. But after a long fight to come back from the accident, the team was able to still earn a top ten with a seventh place finish.

Despite the disappointing finish, the team still

The hard work from all the brothers involved produced yet another great result and more importantly built a foundation for the future successes of the Kappa Sigma Racing Team. Valley Legacy Award

2012 Outstanding Senior - James E. Herriman



On October 11, 2012 James E. Herriman was honored at the 8th Annual Valley Legacy Awards with the "Valley Legacy Award – 2012 Outstanding Senior".

This honor was presented to him at an Avion On The Water luncheon ceremony in Canfield,

OH attended by 260 individuals from around the Mahoning Valley - a three-county area neighboring Youngstown, OH.

The event sponsors, Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Retirement Services, Inc., area banks, businesses, and media organizations, gave this award to five seniors selected from 29 nominees. A panel of 10 judges chose the five recipients based upon their community service. Mr. Herriman was nominated by John E. Gysegem, a long-time friend and work associate.

Jim Herriman has shown his dedication to the area in numerous ways - as a member of Trumbull 100 which provides leadership and funding for projects such as the Trumbull County Veterans Memorial Park, Warren Amphitheater, Tech Belt Energy Center, the Market Street Bridge renovation, for which he personally raised \$25,000, and other downtown beautification. He has been a long standing officer/member of the Warren Civic Music Association (non-profit fine arts group producing six shows annually featuring nationally recognized artists at Warren's Packard Music Hall and Convention Center), chaired various levy campaigns for Howland Local Schools, served on the Howland Local Schools Board of Education as president and vice president, and held leadership roles on the boards of Someplace Safe Inc. (a domestic violence agency), the First Presbyterian Church in Warren, Main Street Warren and the United Way of Trumbull County. As a board member of Warren GROW's (Grass-roots Revitalization Of Warren) he spearheaded a Make-A-Difference-Day project to clean up and beautify Warren's Riverwalk which received national attention, won a monetary award and an article in USA Weekend Magazine as a unique and well supported community Make-A-Difference-Day project involving almost 300 volunteers..

Jim was retired from Packard Electric Division of General Motors in 1992, and resides in Warren, OH with his wife, Katylu (Hutson) Herriman, also a 1958 Purdue grad. They have three sons and eight grandchildren.

Jim was initiated by Chi in May '55. As a senior at Purdue, he was a board member and Business Manager of the OSS (Office of Student Services), served as an Old Masters host and was a member of Gimlet Club. He served on Student Senate, sang in University Choir, and participated in Mock Political Convention. As a sophomore, he was selected for Skull and Crescent and then served as the Pledge Trainer the following year.

Bob Sawyer was the real deal.

We lost a brother and a great friend when Bob "The SAW" Sawyer passed away in March of this year. No one was a stronger for long – that was Bob – and "back in the day" if you ever accompanied him on the way to class or went with him to Harry's, or the sweet shop, you started to think, "this guy knows everybody on campus." That was who he was throughout his life. And if you didn't want to hear the truth, then best you not ask him for his opinion.

He loved family, hunting, and the great outdoors. Collecting and trading all things sports was a passion. He also loved his dogs, Purdue, and Kappa Sigma.

For the past decade, Bob had some significant and painful health issues. That didn't stop the man.
